Dear CS,

Following are my views towards population strategy:

1. Since minimum wage in HK is just HKD 30 per hour which is a relatively low level compared to that in USA or Western countries. The disparity between poor and rich people is high. The house price in HK is

extremely high but minimum wage is low. Compared with USA or Western countries, their house is not that high but minimum wage is much higher than that in HK.

If government want to import labour, I think the minimum wage should be increased to a level of HKD 60 per hour or more. Otherwise, labour should not be imported.

2. Also, there are already too many University graduates in HK. HK government should not allow more University graduates to come to HK for competition.

HK society is for all HK people, not just for the convenience of Business sectors nor owners. So, HK government should not allow more University graduates to come to HK or allow China/overseas graduates to remain in HK after graduation. That only gives more convenience for the business sectors to have more choice but it is not for the good sake of normal local HK people, nor local young people.

3. 150 mainland immigrants per day to HK - Understood that it cannot be avoided. But for these people, I suggest government to force them to attend ERB training courses when they first come to HK so that they can join the labour market, rather than just getting the CSSA after coming to HK.

4. HK government should use policies to promote birth rate in HK. Failure in Singapore or other countries do not mean that it will fail in HK. HK should be more creative to use new and good policies to advocate birth of babies, such as allowances for pregnancy and birth, baby caring centres should be opened to give more facilities and services for young couples.

The key point is that HK couples want to have babies but both of them may have to work that they have no time to take care babies. HK government should think in this way to help them to solve the problems.
